Is God Setting You Up To Fail?

This is the 3rd new moon since God delivered them out of Egypt (3 months). The time for the reunion is set. Everyone's happy and anxious. BUT... there's a problem.

- **Ex. 19:12** [*And God said*], “*And you shall set limits for the people all around, saying, ‘Take care not to go up into the mountain or touch the edge of it. Whoever touches the mountain shall be put to death.’*” God brings them out of Egypt only to say “Don’t get near Me or you’ll die.” Is God setting them up?
- Have you ever felt like you’ve been set up by God?
- **Ex. 19:5** *Now therefore, if you will indeed obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples, for all the earth is mine.* As a Christian, how does this play out in your life?
- Since we’re saved by Grace through Faith in Christ alone, what does Exodus 19:5 mean for the Christian? Do we simply ditch the ‘keep My covenant’ part? Why or why not?

God does set us up. He sets us up to see our failures. He sets us up to realize we cannot please Him on our own. God sets us up to repent. And in repentance we better understand God’s good news for us in Jesus, which moves us to *live out* the salvation we already possess.

FOCUSING THE MISSION OF MESSIAH

With so many changes all around us, one of the things that has stayed the same is our heart and need for Messiah's food pantry. We have been able to help countless homeless and other struggling families especially during this time of the COVID virus. As we come back together again, to strengthen this ministry, we will renew its focus.

To better serve the community and address various safety concerns at our church/school, instead of having the food pantry open certain hours on weekdays at Messiah, we will collect our offerings and donations and deliver them to other pick-up sites. With a transition in employees and volunteers, this small difference will help tremendously and ideally affect both our relationship with those in need and strengthen our partnership with other local charities.

After Thursday, June 25th, we will no longer have box pick-up at our church/school location. We will take the following weeks to focus the mission of Messiah so that we may be better at coming together and serving both the homeless demographic and young families/parents in need.

It is our hope to partner with the Pregnancy Center and Birthright to care for young families 0-1 years of age and then continue to provide for those in need with children 1+ at our church/school location. This will serve both to be a light to all, specifically to young families (and single parents) in our area and build a relationship with the community and our church/school. We look forward to helping young families and single mothers more in the upcoming school year.
