

Psalm 66:5 *E Pluribus Unum*

E Pluribus Unum is the motto of the United States. It's Latin for "Out of many, one." (a little fun fact: there were the original 13 states in 1776, there are 13 stripes on the American flag, and this motto has 13 letters!) It was approved by the United States Congress in 1782.

E Pluribus Unum: there are the "many people" who are brought into "one" singular patriotism and singular ideology, namely freedom.

Psalm 66 in its entirety is structured as *E Pluribus Unum*. It begins with a universal call out to the entire world. By the end of the Psalm, it moves to the individual. Between the universal call and the individual stands the community of faith.

This is a missional psalm that puts the call out to the world to trust Jesus.

- What are some events recorded in this psalm that would call people to put their trust in Yhwh God?
- Is it possible for a Christian to ask an unbeliever or doubter to put their trust in Jesus when the Christian's trust is weak or non-existent?
- Read Luke 10:17. The disciples are fresh off a witnessing tour. They seem to have a smidgen of spiritual elite-ness upon their return. How can this turn people off to Christianity?
- How would God want His people to reach out to the *E Pluribus* so that they may become *Unum* in Jesus?
- Are there areas in your life where there are some trust issues with Jesus?
